

10 TIPS WHEN LOOKING FOR A CACHE

- Use your eyes

Be alert of your surroundings when locating the location of your cache

- Look for something that seems out of place

Caches appear in many forms and may be hiding deep inside other objects

- Geocaches are often disguised

You may not always know whether something is or is not a genuine cache

- Think like a detective

Where would a geocache best be hidden?

- Geocaches are never buried

They may be visible on the ground

- ...Look high, look low, look around

Be sure to look everywhere

- ...Respect your surroundings

- Check the hint

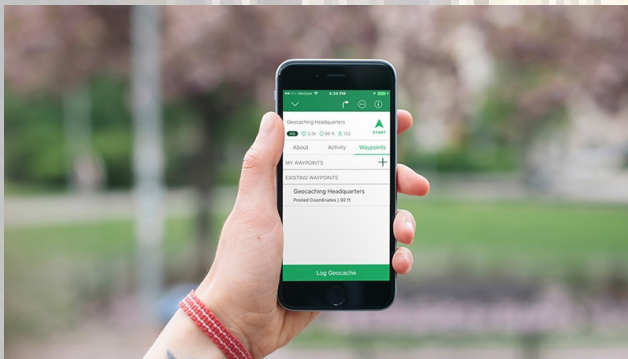
There are many hints to locating a cache

- Check the latest activity

Other geocachers may be posting hints online

- Be patient with yourself

GEOCACHING CREED

Goal of the game: orient new players to the ethos of geocaching and guide experienced players in questionable situations

Manager: the geocaching community, without direction from Geocaching HQ

Rules:

When placing or finding geocaches...

- Not put myself or others in danger.
- Observe all laws & rules of the area.
- Do not destroy or trespass any property.
- Do not do anything that could cause any disruptions or public alarm.
- Minimize your and others' impact on the environment.
- Be considerate of others.
- Protect the game's integrity.

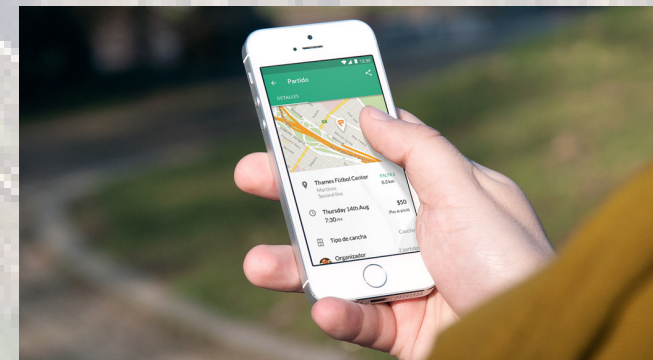
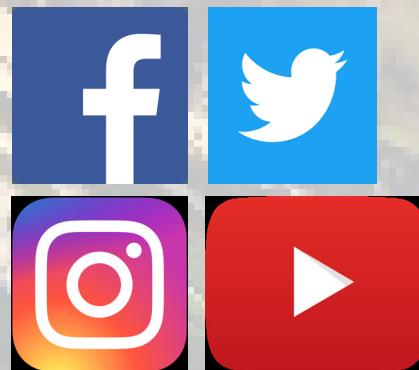

INTRO TO GEOCACHING

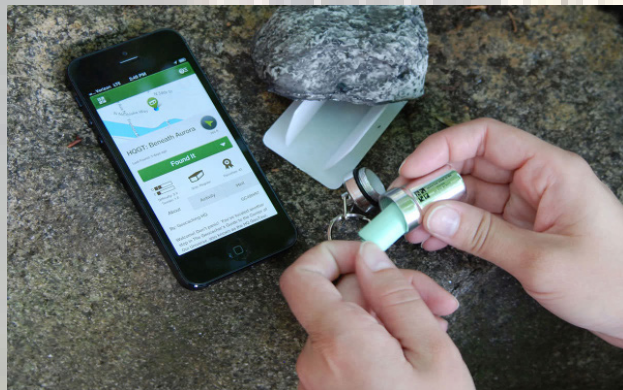
- Geocaching is a globally massive treasure hunt
- Millions of geocaches worldwide
- Ways to navigate geocaches: the Geocaching app and a GPS device

Geocaching with the app

- Choose a cache and use the directions
- Sign the logbook once you find the cache
- Return the logbook and cache to their original location
- If you wish, share your experience

Geocaching with a GPS

- Go to the Geocaching.com website
- Choose a cache
- Get coordinates to help find your cache
- Sign the logbook once you find the cache
- Return the logbook and cache to their original location
- If you wish, share your experience



LOG A GEOCACHE

Find a cache and sign the logbook.

Be respectful of the environment and do not destroy property around you. Be alert whether some is or is not geocaching.

- Find the cache and sign the logbook
- Return the cache to its original place

Log your find online

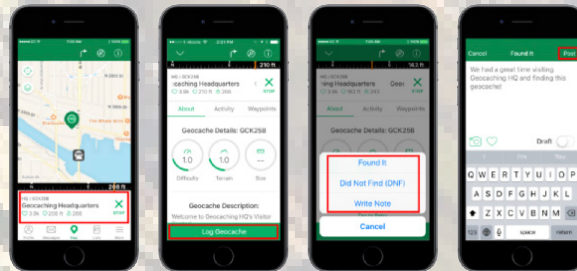
Before posting your log, read the cache page. There are special requirements for some cache types, and your log could be deleted if you don't fulfill those requirements.

On Geocaching.com

- Select Log geocache from the top right corner of the cache page.
- Select your Log Type and write your log.
- Select Post.

On the Geocaching app

- From map view, select the cache information at the bottom of the screen.
- Select Log Geocache.
- Select from log types: Found It, Did Not Find (DNF), or Write Note.
- Write your log.
- Select Post in the top right.



There are certain rules to follow in order to make this game a highly enjoyable one for all:

1. Sign both the logbook and log your find online to get your smiley.
2. Accept your Did not find (DNF) logs. These let others know that a particular cache may be difficult to find, and to be more aware of the container.
3. For trinkets from geocache, leave something family-friendly of equal or greater value, **BUT NO FOOD**.
4. Be aware of who is or is not geocaching, as geocaches may be stolen by accident.
5. Never trespass anyone's property, since geocaches never allow you to do so.
6. When leaving the geocache, try not to disturb the environment or wildlife in it.
7. If you find a problematic cache, please contact the owner immediately or consult the Geocaching website.
